To be an emotional support animal the dog not only needs to be affectionate, loyal but also intelligent around the companion suffering from emotional and mental difficulties or disorders. To assist their human companions, the dogs have to have a certain intelligence in feeding off of ques and being always under control and obedient. Such dogs are often a common sight as service animals, therapy dogs, as well as emotional support animals (ESA).

Before going any further one needs to address what does a dog as an emotional support animal does. The emotional support animal such as a dog or any other pet helps their human companions cope with their mental and emotional problems— PTSD, panic attacks, autism, depression to name a few— and live a normal life.

To have a pet as an emotional support animal, the pet owner needs to be evaluated for his/her condition by a licensed mental health specialist, who then deems whether it's necessary for the person to have an emotional support animal or not. The permission takes the form of an authorized, stamped, and signed the <u>esa letter for housing</u> that the specialist provides the person with.

ESAs and their companions enjoy various much-needed benefits:

They are allowed to travel with their pet animal present with them in the passenger compartment of an airline carrier. They are protected by federal laws and the Air Carrier Access Act of 1986.

Under, the pet owners can also have the pet animals in their houses and living spaces overriding the nopet policies and unlawful pet fees. Why do ESAs need to be intelligent?

ESAs need to have certain qualities that make them perfect candidates be emotional support animals. The type of pet dog that one adopts or brings home should be chosen according to the lifestyle of the person suffering from a mental or emotional problem. This can be a dog suited for apartment or indoor living, it can be an outdoor dog, or it can be a family dog that behaves well around children and others.

No matter what type of breed that you get to be your <u>esa letter</u>, they need to be intelligent in their adaptability to situations, in judging the emotional condition of the human companion, and in following commands and always being under the control of the human companion.
